



PARCS AND GARDENS OF PARIS

BOIS DE BOULOGNE

Paris 16^{ème}

Métro 1 : Porte Maillot

In the heart of the wood is located the Bagatelle

Park in which you can visit the greenhouse gardens of Auteuil or the acclimatization garden.



BOIS DE VINCENNES



Paris 12^{ème}

Métro 8 : Porte Dorée

The Vincennes wood is the biggest green Parisian space. Originally, it was the exclusive chasing ground for the French kings. It includes a zoo, a floral park, Paris' farm, the Buddhist and Tibetans temples, a tropical garden and the tropical and agronomic research institute, as well as the horticulture school with its arboretum.

JARDIN ATLANTIQUE

Place des cinq martyrs du Lycée Buffon Paris 15^{ème}

Métro 4, 6, 12 ou 13 : Montparnasse Bienvenue

Inaugurated in 1994 and developed above the TGV rails, it constitutes the most wonderful waiting room for travellers departing for the Atlantic.



JARDIN DES CHAMPS ELYSEES

Avenue des Champs Elysées Paris 8^{ème}

Métro 1 ou 13 : Champs Elysées-Clémenceau

The Napoleonic guards camped there in 1815 when the Russian Army repelled them.

JARDIN DES HALLES

105, rue Rambuteau Paris 1^{er}

RER A, B ou D : Châtelet les Halles

Offers playgrounds for the youngest and shaded paths for the eldest, Ponds, greenhouses and a scented garden.



JARDIN DES PLANTES



57, rue Cuvier Paris 5^{ème}

Métro 7 ou 10 : Jussieu

Héritier du jardin royal des plantes médicinales, créé en 1626 sous Louis XIII. Ouvert au public depuis 1640. Aujourd'hui c'est un lieu unique en France, riche d'un patrimoine exceptionnel.

Heir of the royal garden of medical Plants created in 1626 under the order of Louis XIII. Opened to the citizens since 1640. Today, it's a unique place in France, with an exceptional heritage.

JARDIN DES TUILERIES

Paris 1^{er}

Métro 1 : Tuileries

A wonderful garden à la Française that extends between the Louvre pyramid and the Concorde place.



JARDIN DU LUXEMBOURG

Paris 6^{ème}

RER B : Luxembourg

The Luxemburg garden, adjacent to the Senat palace, built in the past for Marie de Medicis, is one of the most romantic place in Paris.

JARDIN DU PALAIS ROYAL

Paris 1^{er}

Métro 1 : Palais Royal

This peaceful and nostalgic garden is encircled in a superb architectural set.



PARC ANDRÉ CITROËN

Paris 15^{ème}

Métro 8 : Ballard

Built on the site of a former Citroën automobile manufacturing plant, the park is named after company founder André Citroën. When it opened in 1993 it was the largest park to open in Paris in more than a century.



PARC DE BAGATELLE

Paris 16^{ème} (Bois de Boulogne)

Métro 1 : Porte Maillot

The Bagatelle's rosary is a high place of horticulture. The park is a real art condense of the last three centuries.

PARC DE BELLEVILLE

Paris 20^{ème}

Métro 2 : Couronnes

As well as giant trees and varied plant life, little bridges, rocks, caves, expanses of water and artificial waterfalls add to the charm and romantic aspect of the park.



PARC DE BERCY

41, rue Paul Belmondo (Paris 12^{ème})

Métro 6 : Bercy

With a combined area of 13.9 hectares, composed of three different Gardens on different themes connected by foot bridges, it is the tenth largest park in the city.



PARC DE LA VILLETTE

211, avenue Jean Jaurès (Paris 19^{ème})

Métro 7 : Porte de la Villette

This is the largest stretch of greenery within Paris, combining nature, architecture, children's playground, exhibition and show venues.



PARC DES BUTTES CHAUMONT

Paris 19^{ème}

Métro 11 : Pyrénées, Buttes Chaumont

Its construction on quarries explains its impressive steepness and change in levels and heights. Visitors can appreciate stunning views of the city from this hilly setting, especially in the Montmartre district.

PARC FLORAL DE PARIS

Esplanade du Château (Paris 12^{ème})

Métro 1 : château de Vincennes

The Parc floral de Paris is a public park and botanical garden located within the Bois de Vincennes in the 12th arrondissement of Paris. It is one of four botanical gardens in Paris, and is the site of major annual flower shows.



PARC GEORGES BRASSENS

Rue des Morillons (Paris 15^{ème})

Métro 12 : Convention

Opened in 1984, it occupies 7.74 hectares on the site of a former fish market, horse market and slaughterhouse, and preserves some of the old market structures. It is named for the French popular singer Georges Brassens who lived in the neighborhood of the park.



PARC MONCEAU

Paris 8^{ème}

Métro 2 : Monceau

Parc Monceau is a public park situated in the 8th arrondissement of Paris. At the main entrance is a rotunda. The park covers an area of 8.2 hectares (20.3 acres).



PARC MONTSOURIS

Paris 14^{ème}

RER B : Cité Universitaire

Created at each of the cardinal points of the compass around the city, in order to provide green space and recreation for the rapidly growing population of Paris. The Park contains a lake, a cascade, wide sloping lawns, and many notable varieties of trees, shrubs and flowers. It is also home to a meteorology station.



PROMENADE PLANTEE

Paris 12^{ème}

Métro 1 : Bastille

The Coulée verte René-Dumont or Promenade plantée (French for tree-lined walkway) or the Coulée verte (French for green course) is a 4.7 km (2.9 mi) elevated linear park built on top of obsolete railway infrastructure in the 12th arrondissement of Paris.



SERRES D'AUTEUIL

Paris 16^{ème}

Métro 10: Porte d'Auteuil

In 1998 they became part of the Jardin botanique of Paris.

Today the greenhouses produce about 100,000 plants per year for the interior decoration of municipal buildings.
